Cooperative Programs between Satsukidai Hospital and Vietnam

Vietnamese Nursing Training Project

- Satsukidai Hospital took the lead in foreign nursing training programs working with AHP Networks for the first time in Japan.
- Until 2008, 56 people from Vietnam have acquired National Nursing Licenses in Japan, and have worked in local hospitals. (Since 1994)
